## OPEN LETTER

REGARDING THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION EXCLUDING BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA FROM THE LIST OF WEST BALKAN COUNTRIES GRANTED VISA-FREE ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE EU

Dear Sirs,

We support the European Commission recommendation to lift visa restrictions on Serbia, Montenegro and Macedonia, which constitutes for those countries certainly a huge, legitimate step towards the European Union, finally granting their citizens visa-free EU travel. However, we are also very much concerned over the fact that Bosnia and Herzegovina is excluded from the recommendation, which is a major failure of the European policy towards Bosnia and Herzegovina and yet another disappointment on the part of the Bosnia-Herzegovina citizens in the European politics.

With this recommendation, the European Commission discourages the citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina and encourages those policies which have been disintegrating Bosnia and Herzegovina over many years and doing everything to keep Bosnia and Herzegovina as far as possible from the European values and European prospects. The European Commission recommendation is a unique discrimination against those citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina who have one citizenship – that of Bosnia-Herzegovina.

After the European Union's unsuccessful politics during the war in Bosnia and Herzegovina and its failure to prevent genocide against Bosniaks in Srebrenica in July 1995, today, 14 years later, in the same month, that same European Union has made a decision to put Bosnia and Herzegovina further into isolation.

We condemn, in the strongest possible terms, the exclusion of Bosnia and Herzegovina from the decision and request that also the citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina be granted visa-free arrangements with the EU as from 1 January, 2010.
